Published cases – Itin v. Ungar, 17 P.3d 129(Colorado Supreme Court allowed treble damages for civil theft in a commercial setting); Ajay Sports Inc. v. Casazza, 1 P.3d 267(Colorado Court of Appeals in a case of first impression permitted apportionment of punitive damages among defendants by the jury); Cache National Bank v. Hinman, 626 F. Supp. 1341(Federal District Court permitted claim by former bank president for contribution to proceed against bank directors), Southwestern Development Company v. Humphrey, 709 P.2d 51, rev'd in part, 734 P.2d 637(Colorado Supreme Court held that district courts have jurisdiction to determine title to water rights, not state water courts).
